PRESIDENT'S PAGE

I regretfully report that I have filed charges of theft on Secretary-Treasurer William Pagano. The following is a time line of events that transpired to lead up to his suspension and ultimately his resignation. On December 21, 2006 I suspected some impropriety of Branch funds. After reviewing the Branch books and other documents I discovered what appeared to be theft of Branch funds. After further investigation my suspicions were true. The following morning at approximately 9 am, I closed all bank accounts and filed charges with the Franklin County Sheriffs Department. I turned over copies of all documents that will help in the investigation. Because of the ongoing investigation that is taking place, more information will be divulged in the future.

The branch has retained a Certified Public Accountant, chosen at random to help audit and conduct a proper investigation. We are going back to the beginning of 1999,

reviewing each check and voucher carefully.

Many rumors are circulating, most of which are not true. I assure you that as your branch President no other officers are involved. I also assure you that I have put measures in place to help deter a theft. Unfortunately the system we had dealt much on trust. Our previous treasurer, Mike Sargent, was a man of stellar principles and would never compromise his morals for a dollar. Shamefully that system was compromised with a shame that is unprecedented by our past treasurer Bill Pagano. I will keep you informed of any future events and I also give you my word that I will expect nothing less than full restitution of any loss. Whatever happens to Mr. Pagano, well he chose that path, it is on him.

I will be attending the rap session scheduled in January. Most of it will be on the contract negotiations. It should prove to be interesting. I will make every effort to let the membership know of any new movement towards

A MESSAGE FROM VICE PRESIDENT BOB SOLT

The contract negotiations have come to a standstill. Hopefully we will have some information after the RAP Session in Los Angeles on January 27th and 28th. The USPS has proposed no pay increases the first year and a 1 percent increase in the second and third years. The USPS also wants the Letter Carriers who have family coverage health insurance to pay an additional \$1,300 a year. The USPS negotiation team proposed that all Cost of Living Allowances be lump summed and would not be included in wage rates. They have the audacity to want the COLA clause eliminated at the end of the contract. The compassionate upper management wants to eliminate the no layoff clause, local negotiations, increase the number of low-paid, no-benefit workers and permit managers to perform bargaining unit work. This would probably not be on a day when it is ten degrees out, snow covered, ADVO, Pit Bulls and ten trays of DPS while being told by a socially challenged supervisor they are one hour and fifty-four minutes light. The USPS has also proposed large cuts in annual and sick leave, Sunday premiums and overtime premiums. This comes from an organization that had 9.3 billion dollars in profits over the past three years and eliminated its

entire outstanding debt? Who believes the USPS does not appreciate the hard work of Letter Carriers? They do want to increase the uniform allowance by a more than generous 2.5 percent.

As we go into the inclement weather season we are receiving telephone calls from Letter Carriers that have been injured on the job. Quite a lot of the injuries are the slip, trip and fall type of accidents. It is bad enough when a Letter Carrier is doing his job day in and day out, year after year and then gets injured. Most of the calls I receive are from Carriers that have fallen, tried to walk it off but are unable to do so. If you are injured at work report it immediately. Management states they want to get the injured employee medical attention immediately. Management's solution seems to be to issue discipline to the disobedient. Their theory is that it is not an accident because it is preventable. So far I have not received one call from a Carrier that has said they threw themselves down on the ground to purposely get injured. I did speak with a Letter Carrier with more than twenty five years seniority that has never had an on the job injury until recently. The Carrier had serious injuries, which with all reasonable probability were not self-inflicted. Management's solution was to conduct a PDI. The management representative condescendingly declared the Carrier was guilty of some postal policy that forbids accidents and he should receive discipline.

Once again branch 78 will be sending a delegation to Washington D.C. the trip is scheduled for Tuesday May 8th and Wednesday May 9th. This is the trip we make for the congressional breakfast. This is an excellent opportunity to meet with fellow Letter Carriers from all areas of Ohio. Meeting with the Carriers from various geographical locations from Ohio give one a broader perspective of what is going on with the other Carriers. After we arrive we usually have a reception that is usually chaired by President Bill Young. Most of the other National Officers are in attendance as well as our National Business Agent Bill Cooke. The next morning we have the Congressional breakfast, with many of our Congressmen and Congresswomen in attendance. After the breakfast we will have appointments to meet with some of our elected officials. We will have an opportunity to visit our National NALC offices. We will have a limited amount of time to do some sightseeing. If you've never been there, Washington D.C. is a beautiful city. The Branch will again be providing transportation and lodging. This is one trip everyone should attend at least once.

After we return from Washington D.C. the NALC Food Drive is scheduled for Saturday May 12th. Once again our Branch will need every volunteer that we can get. Branch 78 Trustee Todd Hornyak

FROM THE NORTH....

Two recent changes to Worker's Compensation are evidence of the escalating war being waged by corporations (and the USPS) against the workers of this country. For your protection, letter carriers need to be aware of the changes.

The recently approved Postal Reform Law implements a change to Worker's Compensation that will only affect postal workers.

Previously, letter carriers who suffered a disabling, traumatic injury while working were eligible to have their pay continue uninterrupted without having to use their sick leave or annual leave. This is called Continuation of Pay. Postal Reform has amended the Continuation of Pay rule to require a 3-day waiting period. Now if you get hurt on the job and cannot work because of the injury you must use your sick or annual leave for the first 3 days. If the disability exceeds 14 days or results in permanent disability you can request to have your 3 days of leave reinstated and changed to Continuation of Pay.

President Young initially refused to embrace the Postal Reform Bill because of this change. Postal workers are the

only federal employees that this will affect. In my opinion, it violates a workers compensation directive that prohibits the USPS from discouraging the reporting of on the job injuries. Does anybody believe that all injuries will be reported as required if the person is out of annual or sick leave and may be forced to lose a day or two of pay?

The second attack on worker's compensation may affect only Ohio workers but I am sure that it will be used as a precedent in other states. A Kentucky Fried Chicken employee was badly burned and temporarily disabled while cleaning a pressure cooker.

KFC, successfully, challenged his worker's compensation claim by saying that the employee knowingly violated safety rules while performing his duties. The majority of Ohio's chief justices agreed with the KFC attorney that the employee's willful disregard of the safety rule meant that he "legally surrendered his claim for total disability benefits." A worker's compensation lawyer who is familiar with the case said "the whole underlying premise of worker's compensation is that it is no fault. This changes that whole bargain." He also said

that he expects employers will try to "demolish" worker's compensation by arguing that injured workers were "grossly negligent."

The USPS practice of issuing discipline for accidents sets us up for the same scenario. Letter carriers should instruct stewards to grieve every discipline issued for accidents. Do not let management get away with issuing discipline just for having an accident. They must be specific as to what the behavior was that contributed to the accident and they must identify what safety rule was violated.

There is a class action grievance pending that, if successful, will make postal managers abide by this.

If Worker's Compensation were just taken away from workers there would be a revolt. Instead, corporations will be patient to just chip away at it until 50 or so years from now it won't even exist.

But, on the corporate bright side, I am sure an insurance product will be available that can be bought to partially replace it.

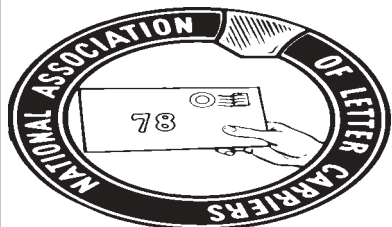
